Anti-Semitism, the Negro problem, and homosexuality appear time and again in the new writing. The old themes with which Hemingway and Fitzgerald shattered Victorian patterns—sex, drinking, the brutalities of war—are no longer shocking. *AFTER THE LOST GENERATION* is a penetrating analysis of post-war fiction that already has provoked wide controversy
